Rules:

1. Over- is a prefix that means “beyond.” (Prefix)
2. –Some is a suffix that means “having” or “like.” (Suffix)
3. Compound sentences are sentences that contain two subjects and verbs that are separated by a comma and conjunction. (Grammar Rule)

“over-” Words	overall overdo overjoyed overboard overpowered overcast overexpose overnight overwhelming overextension overflowing
“-some” Words	lonesome fearsome worrisome burdensome

### **Challenge Words and Phrases from Act II, Scene I of *A Midsummer Night’s Dream* by William Shakespeare:**

1. Shakespeare: legendary author, poet, playwright, and wordsmith
2. Thyme: a wild flowering plant or herb with a strong smell
3. Blows: bursts into bloom
4. Oxlips: a flower that is a hybrid between a cowslip and a primrose
5. Nodding violets: flowers that are bending gently in the breeze
6. Overcanopied: Shakespearean invented word that means forming a canopy
7. Luscious: having a pleasingly sweet taste or smell
8. Woodbine, Muskroses, and Eglantine: three more kinds of flowers
